Nature Safari Interactive Workshop

On Friday 5th July, Nature Safari will be visiting the children in Year 5. Nature Safari offer a fantastic interactive workshop that allows the children to learn and meet some exotic and unique animals and critters. The workshop will be led by Nature Safari and supported by Miss Connell, Mrs Dobson, Mrs Thompson. All Local Authority risk assessments have been completed. The children will remain in school for this workshop.

The purpose of this workshop is to allow children the opportunity to learn about exotic and unique animals and meet them in person. This will inspire the children within our current topic, Fantastic Beasts, and help strengthen and support their learning in writing, art and topic work. Consent must be given via parent pay in order for children to attend this workshop. The children will also be offered the opportunity to handle the animals but this will be the child's choice. If you have any concerns regarding the handling of the creatures, please speak to your child's class teacher.

The cost of this workshop and insurance, will be £4.50. Please contact the school office if you have any questions regarding payment. All enquires will be treated confidentially. This request is for a voluntary contribution and no parent/carer is under any obligation to pay. No pupils at the school will be treated differently according to whether or not their parents have made any contribution. However, if insufficient contributions are forthcoming then the trip may have to be cancelled.

Children will have dinner as normal, ordered with the class teacher on that morning. Uniform should be worn as usual. This workshop will not disrupt the timing of the usual school day and children will finish school at 3:05pm.
