By the end of the topic we will:

History

- Place the Ancient Greek civilization on a timeline, and understand BC and AD
- Describe some features of life in Ancient Greece: clothes, food, homes, transport
- Know about the Greek Gods and what they represented, and be familiar with some Greek Myths
- Understand how we use a range of sources to find out about the past
- Know how the Ancient Greeks influenced our lives: buildings, writing, education, citizenship
- Know some English words that come from the Greek language
- Know about the Ancient Greek Olympic games and compare them to the modern day Games.

Geography

- Locate Greece on maps of Europe and the World
- Use an atlas to find out about Greece's mountains, islands and cities
- Know key facts about the climate and landscape of Greece
- Know how to use keys to interpret symbols and marks.

Science: Magnets

- Understand that magnets attract or repel each other and attract some materials and not others
- Be able to group together everyday materials on the basis of whether they are attracted to a magnet
- Identify and name some magnetic materials
- Describe magnets as having two poles
- Predict whether two magnets will attract or repel each other
- Know about everyday uses of magnets
