Each child needs to at least read one book every week. Each book that a child reads should be written on their Reading Challenge Record Sheet, which we have stuck inside your child's Reading Record. Books should be a range of genres and give your child the opportunity to share a book with a grown up at home. Below, we have listed some recommended reading books that are age appropriate and may interest your child. Your child's class teacher may have a copy of these recommended reading books or you may want to buy your own copy for your child's home library. Your child can also read their book banded reading book, a comic, a newspaper or share a more 'grown up' story with an older sibling or friend.
