National Emergency Services Museum

Dear Parent/Carer

As part of our topic, we are very excited to visit the National Emergency Services Museum and travel back in time to 1666 when a huge fire ravaged London.

The children will learn how the Great Fire was extinguished and the legacy it holds. They will have the opportunity to handle real and replica objects, dress up as a soldier fighting the fire and try some of the methods they used. This experience will enhance the children's knowledge and understanding of the Great Fire of London and participating in the trip will also allow the children to achieve their **bronze cultural experience pledge.**

The date of the trip **is Thursday 3rd February.** Your child should arrive at the usual time for registration and will be dismissed at 3.05 from their classroom door.

School has subsidised this visit, so the cost to you is £12.50 per child, which should be paid through your Parentpay account. As ever, payment is voluntary, but if enough contributions are not received, we will be unable to go ahead with the day. **Please note you will also need to give permission via Parentpay for your child to take part in the day.**
