KS1 Trip to Cleethorpes

On Thursday 4th July 2024, children from KS1 will be going to Cleethorpes. The trip will be led by Mrs Sharp, Mrs Leng and Mrs Ayub and the KS1 staff. All Local Authority risk assessments have been completed. The children will be travelling via Maxfields Coaches. The coach will depart school around 8:45am (children must arrive at school for 8.30am) and return at 3pm.

The purpose of this trip is to provide the children with the exciting experience of visiting the seaside whilst expanding their knowledge of coastal features as part of their fieldwork in Geography.

As this is an enrichment activity, in order for these activities to take place, we ask for payment of £14.45. Please contact the school office if you have any questions regarding payment. All enquiries will be treated confidentially. **ALL payments must be made through Parent Pay.** However, if insufficient payments are forthcoming then the trip may have to be cancelled.

Children will need a packed lunch including a drink (no glass bottles, fizzy pop or chocolate please). If your child would like to order a school please complete the online form which will be included in the email with this letter.

As part of the 'seaside experience', we are asking children to bring a maximum of £3 in an envelope with their name on to enable them to buy an ice cream or ice lolly during the visit.

Uniform should be worn along with suitable clothing for the weather including sensible footwear.

School expects children to behave in an appropriate, sensible manner and to follow the school code of conduct at all times. We reserve the right to refuse access to the visit for children who do not meet the acceptable criteria. If you are happy for your son/daughter to go on this visit, please complete the slip below and return it to their class teacher.
